

RULES

- Persons are admitted to the show ground at their own risk. The organisers will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to spectators, horses, riders or any other person and any loss, damage cost and expenses, however caused.
- The judges' and organisers decisions are final.
- The organisers reserve the right to cancel, combine, add to or amend any class and cannot be held responsible for any costs incurred.
- The organisers recommend that all persons in charge of horses, whether on foot or mounted should wear protective hats approved to the current BS and EU Regulations. In any case, all riders, when mounted, and children under the age of 18 years, when handling horses on foot, must, at all times wear protective hats, as previously described. Persons choosing not to wear a hard hat **MUST** sign the official disclaimer, with respect to headgear, prior to participating in any classes. A parent/guardian must sign the disclaimer on behalf of child/children under the age of 18 years.
- The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry to the showground to any horse they do not consider suitable, to safeguard the public and other competitors against accident
- All horses (except those taking part in Classes 22a,22b & 23) must be **owned** by a current member of the British Appaloosa Society
- Young Handlers must be current members of the society
- Exhibits may be shown with manes hogged, plaited or natural and tails plaited or natural as best suits the animal.
- All foals must be led in-hand, with their dams or alone. Foals must be born in the year of the show.
- Entire horses must be shown bitted from TWO years old. Entire horses are the responsibility of the owner or handler.
- Any misbehaviour or abuse to horses, judges, stewards or organisers, by any competitors, their representatives, grooms or handlers, will result in that person being requested to leave the show ground immediately, without the return of entry fee, etc.
- All animals must be sound.
- Horses competing in English ridden classes must be four years and over
- Horses/ponies being handled in Class 22a&b (Young Handler) may be of any breed, age, sex or size. The handler, not the animal, will be judged in this class.
- All foals must be registered and the necessary forms and payment received by the registrar at the closing date for show entries. All other animals (except those taking part in Class 22a,22b & 23 must be registered with the British Appaloosa Society. No animals with "pending" registrations will be accepted.
- All entries on the day must be accompanied by the correct identification or registration papers (Passports)
- Official Complaints form plus filing details available from the Show Secretary. A filing fee will be charged and refunded if complaint upheld.

IN HAND CLASSES, RING 1 - Start time 8:30

Class 1: Best Conditioned. Any age/sex

Class 2: Sports Horse/Competition Type In Hand - To be shown on a Triangle
Judged on the triangle. Exhibits enter the arena individually, present themselves at the top of the triangle in front of the judge. walk all three sides of triangle, proceed immediately to trot on reaching the top of the triangle, continue around all three sides; halt in front of the judge. All exhibits enter the arena together for the final walk round. To be assessed on athleticism, power and regularity of movement and way of going as suitable for the disciplines of showjumping, eventing or dressage. Triangle approx 20mx20mx20m

Class 3: Riding Horse In hand

Class 4: Hunter In Hand

Class 5: Most Colourful Leopard

Class 6: Most Colourful Blanket

Class 7: Most Colourful Other (this includes solids)

(Classes 1 to 7 open to Main/Annex and Part bred registered)

MOST COLOURFUL CHAMPIONSHIP(1st & 2nd placed from classes 5,6,7)

Class 8: Yearling Fillies, colts, geldings (Main Registered/Annex)

Class 9: 2 & 3 Year old Fillies (Main Registered/Annex)

Class 10: 2 & 3 Year old Geldings (Main Registered/Annex)

Class 11: 2 & 3 Year old Colts (Main Registered/Annex)

Class 12: Mares 4 years and over (Main Registered/Annex) cannot enter 11a as well

Class 14: Geldings 4 years and over (Main Registered/Annex)

Class 15 (a): Broodmares (to have foaled or be in foal for 2017) (Main Registered/Annex)

Class 15 (b): Foals . Must be born in 2017 and four weeks or over (Main Registered/Annex) Mares and foals to enter the ring together but will be judged separately

Class 16: Veterans 15 years and over (open to part bred)

Class 17: BApS Licensed Stallions (Main Register/Annex)

YOUNGSTOCK CHAMPIONSHIP,

Highest placed males and females from classes, 8, 9, 10, 11, 15(b)

MALE CHAMPIONSHIP:

1st & 2nd placed males from Classes 8, 10, 11, 14, 15(b), 16, 17

FEMALE CHAMPIONSHIP:

1st & 2nd placed females from Classes 8, 9, 12, 15(a), 15(b),16

SUPREME IN HAND CHAMPIONSHIP

Champions and Reserves from **YOUNGSTOCK, MALE and FEMALE** Championship)

INHAND PART BRED CLASSES, RING 2, Not before 10:30

Class 18: Part bred Youngstock, yearling to 3years, Geldings and Fillies

Class 19: Part Bred Mares 4 years and over

Class 20: Part Bred Geldings 4 years and over

Class 21(a) Part Bred Broodmares (to have foaled or be in foal for 2017)

Class 21(b) Part Bred Foals. Must be born in 2017 and 4 weeks or over - Mares and foals to enter the ring together but will be judged separately.

PART BRED MALE CHAMPIONSHIP

1st & 2nd males from classes 16,18,20,21(b)

PART BRED FEMALE CHAMPIONSHIP

1st & 2nd placed females from classes 16,18,19,21 (a) & 21(b)

PART BRED SUPREME INHAND CHAMPIONSHIP

(Champions and Reserves from **PART BRED MALE AND FEMALE** Championship)

Ring 1 – Following Supreme Championship

Class 22a: Young Handler 11yrs and under

Class 22b: Young Handler 12-16yrs

Any breed of horse/pony can be shown in class 22a and 22b. Exhibitors will enter the ring at the same time but be judged in two sections. Please note that the handler will be judged not the horse/pony.

RIDDEN CLASSES Ring 1 - NOT BEFORE 1pm

(all horses to be 4yrs and over)

Class 23: Concours d'Elegance - *To be ridden astride OR Side Saddle, Conventional (evening performance) dress OR period costume. Lead reins permitted. To be judged on the overall picture of elegance presented by the horse/pony and rider. Young Handlers may enter on a pony*

Class 24: Ridden turnout

Class 25: Ultra Novice Ridden – *walk and trot only. Horse/rider combination not to have won any ridden showing class. Aimed at true novices/nervous riders. SNAFFLE BRIDLE ONLY, NO SPURS, NECK STRAPS ALLOWED* (Main Registered/Annex and Part bred).

Class 26: Novice Ridden – (Main Registered/Annex)

Class 27: Novice Ridden – (Part bred)

Class 28: Riding Horse/Hunter (Main Registered/Annex/Part Bred)

Class 29: Open Ridden Horse – (Main Registered/Annex)

Class 30: Open Ridden Horse – (Part bred)

Class 31: Riding Club horse (inc 2'3 jump) Main Registered/Annex/Partbred
