Here is the latest bulletin for the week of the 29 February.

Below is a picture of the horses mentioned in last week's bulletin along with details that have already been published.



On the night of the 16th and morning of the 17th February 2 horses have been stolen from a field next to Rank Xerox in Mitchledean Gloucestershire.

The first horse is a bay mare, 12yrs old, 14.3hh. She is a well set "hairy legged" driving cob with a white sock on her off hind.

The second horse is a bay gelding, 20yrs old, 13.2hh. He is also well set possibly a Dales X, he has a small white star.

I am hoping to get a photo from the owner tomorrow to forward to you.

The stolen horse register has been informed.

## A success story...



**A miniature Shetland pony that was stolen over two weeks ago is now recovering at home after being found 33 miles away in Walsall, West Midlands.**

A member of the public, who regularly walks in Slacky Lane in Walsall, noticed the little pony's sudden appearance in the area. The pony was clearly limping and so on Tuesday, 19 February 2008 a call was made to the RSPCA.

When RSPCA Inspector Simon Davies arrived he called out a local veterinary surgeon to treat a puncture wound on the pony's back leg. Upon checking over the two-year-old pony, Inspector Davies discovered a freemark indicating that she was registered with the company Farmkey.

Farmkey confirmed the pony was reported missing on Sunday, 3 February 2008 and was owned by a couple living in Warwickshire. Inspector Davies contacted the owners who were thrilled to hear that Megan had been found.

### **What is a freemark?**

Freezemarking is a safe, humane and distinctive way of protecting your horse from theft. The Farmkey four digit mark is unique to your horse and makes the horse instantly identifiable.

Farmkey is the UK's number one equine security organisation with 30 years experience in freezemarking, and also hold a Royal Warrant for a horse freezemarking security service for the Queen.

"This Shetland pony has been reunited with her owner thanks to the fact she was freezemarked," said Inspector Davies.

"We always encourage people to get their pet microchipped and this is a similar system where the animal has a unique code which makes your pet easily identifiable. Hopefully this story will encourage other pet owners to act and have their animals chipped or freezemarked."

we have noticed an increase in the number of suspicious vehicles - two in particular that appear to be "checking out" the yard here at Mopley Farm. First vehicle is a silver for escort van L504 BEL seen three times and has been challenged three times by different people. Always the same story they are fishermen wanting to fish but at Mopley the lake is syndicated. The two lads are "skinhead" type with tattoos on neck and hands and generally try to run away before being challenged. Both guys are about late 20's or early 30's. The silver van is quite clean for a van of its age and they claim to be from Fordingbridge! The second vehicle we haven't managed to get the details as they make off too quick but is a red or maroon coloured 4-wheel drive type car and was seen driving around the lane to our yard towing a green horse trailer - again its nothing to do with our yard or the Mopley Riding club members. I forgot to mention that two lorries parked up in the car park were broken into overnight and items stolen plus the diesel was drained from their tanks. I would appreciate your passing this onto the relevant people and possibly giving space to this in one of your forums. Grapevine news has it that there is a group operating out of Basingstoke and that these vans could be tied into them but that is "grapevine". The accent from the two lads above is english not irish and is southern English at that. The tattoo on the neck of the driver is that of a chinese dragon. Hope this helps make people aware and helps.

## Another speed clamp on animal accident hotspot

Verderers have urged police to continue to clamp down on speeding motorists to reduce the number of animal accidents in the New Forest.

The verderers announced that, in particular, operations need to be stepped up on the B3054, an accident hotspot for animals.

They were pleased with the successful speed enforcement operation

between Hill Top and Dibden that was launched by police on the road in January.

Twelve drivers were stopped for speeding with all those caught being locals. It was reported that current statistics show that the majority of animals killed or hit by vehicles were by locals.

Most offences have happened overnight on Sunday into Monday or Monday into</p>			

Tuesday. Please keep em peeled.

Meanwhile the theft of plant equipment has raised its head again with several incidents around the area, most offences are occurring at new building sites (as there are plenty of new builds going up) however farms and outbuildings have also been targetted. Again most offences are happening overnight period.
